As this is our Pre-Pesach issue of My Circle, I wanted to share with you how proud I am to belong to a community that understands and appreciates the importance of giving.

Many of you grew up as I did, in homes where giving came naturally. There was always room for another seat around the table, another potato in the pot, another coin in the 'pushkeh'.

I remember the Pesach seder of my youth. My father, a Holocaust survivor, would recount the going out from slavery – a story that was, in essence, his own. His admonition, "Do not forget that you were once a slave in Egypt," was a call to action: to take responsibility for one another and never forget the needy.

As we are a people who have emerged time and again from oppression,

this sense of social responsibility both describes us and defines us. It was there at the beginning of our nationhood. It was there when Jewish Care was founded more than 170 years ago. This sense of duty continues to drive and inspire us today.

But more than obligation, giving is a privilege. It is the means by which we lighten our fellow's burden. It is the way we make our world brighter. Giving empowers us. It gives our life meaning, direction and purpose. As stated so eloquently by former Chief Rabbi of the British Empire, Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, "To live is to give." The inverse, I believe, is also true: "To give is to live."

That is why I feel so fortunate to count this exceptional myself amongst community of givers - a community that does not turn a blind eye to the

vulnerable and the frail, a community for whom the opening declaration of the Pesach seder, "Let those who are hungry, come and eat," is a way of life. Whether you have shared your time, your talents or your wisdom, whether you have donated to our Annual Appeal or created a legacy for the future thank you for being part of our circle of care. On behalf of all those whose lives you've enriched, thank you for giving life and making the world a better place.

GOING UP!



Construction of The Hannah and Daryl Cohen Family Building has passed the halfway mark.

The state-of-the-art facility will feature 14 houses spread across levels three through nine. Each house will consist of 16 rooms around a shared lounge, kitchen and outdoor balcony courtyard, supporting an active and heimish lifestyle for residents as they age. The lower two floors will offer allied health services, cafes, shops and offices.
