"Jewish Care has been a life saver to the youngest and oldest members of my family. I first became involved with Jewish Care in 1989 when my son Darren, who was then a 20-year old with an intellectual disability, applied for a job as a "Man Friday" – sending and collecting the post, making deliveries, setting up rooms for meetings and general office admin. Well, thirty years later and Darren is still there, and he still loves his job!

I am grateful to the many staff who over the years have given their time for Darren. They have mentored him and encouraged him. They have helped him through difficult patches which have arisen. Darren was involved in new programs such as a leadership program in conjunction with the City of Glen Eira. He gained new abilities including office and IT skills. The kindness and support from so many people across Jewish Care has helped him to strive and to thrive.

My dear mother, Nina Kliger, was a resident of Jewish Care, where she spent her last 2 ½ years until her passing in 2015. The first class care she received from dedicated staff was untiring, kind and compassionate. I keep them in my prayers and I thank Jewish Care for making Nina's last years as good as they possibly could be and for walking with our family through a very difficult time.

Our family has benefitted in so many ways from Jewish Care. For this reason, we have made provision for a legacy gift so that Jewish Care can continue to help our community in need – the oppressed, the young, the unemployed, people with a disability and the elderly. The quality of a mentsch is to be judged on how a person (or an organisation) treats their most vulnerable. Against that benchmark, I believe Jewish Care sets the gold standard."

Excitement is mounting with the opening of the Hannah and Daryl Cohen Family Building at St Kilda Road only a month away. Overlooking the gateway to St Kilda Road, the spacious 156-room aged care home offers comfort and independence with beautiful rooms and personalised support. Spanning nine storeys, there will be seven levels of residential aged care and two levels of essential community services including a synagogue, health and medical services,

financial services, an employment centre as well as retail spaces for residents and visitors.
