What is Mental Health Promotion?

Mental health promotion refers to actions taken to maximise mental health and wellbeing across a target population. Mental health promotion is different from, but complementary to, mental health service delivery.

In Australia, it is estimated that in any given year, 1 in 5 people will be affected by a diagnosable mental illness. This equates to around 10,000 Jewish Victorians.

Jewish Care's Mental Health Promotion initiative was created to improve the mental health literacy of the Victorian Jewish community, and promote positive mental health.

The Mental Health Promotion initiative has three primary target areas:



1. Increasing Community Awareness

- Increasing awareness and recognition of mental illness
- Encouraging the community to seek our support, as well as external providers, for mental health issues
- Enhancing clients' and carers' understanding and knowledge of the mental health service system
- Promoting strategies that support positive mental health
- Combating negative stigma
- Supporting social inclusion

2. Service System Engagement

- Supporting consideration of the Jewish community in local area health planning
- Building the cultural awareness of mental health service providers
- Supporting cultural appropriateness of mainstream mental health messaging
- Facilitating referrals within the mental health service system
- Providing secondary consultation

3. Building Staff Capacity

- Supporting our status as a mental health friendly organisation
- Providing training and education to support innovation and ensure best practice
- Providing information and resources
